What you can expect when visiting A Pirate's Life for Me

Pre booked groups will be met by a designated member of staff. That staff member will not stay with your group, but will be able to answer any questions, help you stow away your coats and signpost you.

The exhibition is designed with and for children ages 0-12 years – but we think it will appeal to all! Throughout the exhibition there are films, sounds, cases of artefacts, costume, props and a ship to explore!

Rozelle House is a listed 18th century Mansion, with its original grand rooms and fireplaces. There is a rough route to follow, but feel free to roam and explore!

Hallway – Welcome to our 16th century Tudor Street. Its night, as that's when Pirates like to go about! The harbour is near – can you smell the sea?

The Tavern - The dark red colour here evokes a cosy, dimly lit pub, where pirates make plans and do deals. Join our crew here!

The Bazaar - A busy market place where pirates spend their pirate booty, on looking good and eating well.

The Ship – By now you'll be ready to sail the seven seas! Have a go at steering the ship, but be careful, if you're rubbish, you'll be walking the plank!

Treasure Island - Can you find the buried treasure?
